January Host Clubs

The WCHS January events will take place at Magnolia Game Farm and Little Creek Lodge. We would like to share a bit about each club with you.

Magnolia Game Farm, a new host club this year, is a 1,240-acre upland hunting preserve located South of Evansville at 15007 West County A. The club is owned and operated by Rick McCoy and Al McCoy. They are open to the public from October 1 to April 1, offering pheasant, chukar, and quail. Due to technology limitations in the Magnolia Game Farm clubhouse, we will not be able to run credit card transactions. If you would like to pay for your entries via credit card, we will need

to take down your information and run the transaction before or after the tournament. Because of this, payment by check or cash is recommended.

Many of you are already familiar with Little Creek Lodge located at 4219 Sampson Road just North of Green Bay in Little Suamico. This year they will be hosting their eight annual WCHS event. Little Creek offers 700 continuous acres for upland bird hunting to their members from September 15 to March 15. Beyond upland hunting opportunities, they also offer automated sporting clay courses, a multilevel 5-stand, and a pistol and rifle range. Amateur players, you don't want to miss this one next year.

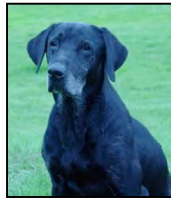
